## Infant and Young Child Feeding and Maternal Nutrition

Seba Jagat in order to bring growth and development of children through strengthened communication skill of the frontline health care providers has been implementing the program in 80 remote villages of Lanjigarh, Golamunda and Narla blocks (42 villages in Lanjigarh, 20 villages in Golamunda & 18 villages in Narla block) in Kalahandi District.

With the basic intention to strengthen the communication and facilitation skills of frontline functionaries through participatory communication practices, the intervention focused on bringing about behavior change towards Maternal Infant Young Child Feeding (MIYCF) practices at individual, family and community level. Secondly, the intervention also identified critical stakeholders and ensured an interface with these different stake holders at regular intervals it support the process of normative change amongst communities. Orientation meetings with frontline functionaries like anganwadi workers, ASHAs, ANMs, and village facilitators at regular interval have



generated learning and behavioral change practices amongst communities' members. Simultaneously, meeting with members of tribal samaj, traditional healers and panchayat functionaries on their traditional practices like child marriage and its negative effects is slowly bringing new consciousness among them. Interactive sessions with adolescents in schools, participation at VHND, information sharing with ASHAs during monthly cluster meetings have helped to improve awareness levels of community and communication skills of frontline functionaries.

## Others Innovation Activities:

**Annaprassana Ceremony :** Organized 56 Annaprassana Ceremony with the present of mother, caregiver of children and community members of the village. By this effort 156 children are started timely complimentary feeding with appropriate message (enhanced knowledge on quality, quantity and frequency of complimentary feeding) along with counseled on Hand washing method, health and hygienic, care of weak or sick child etc



### Referred to children on Mega health Camp - Lifeline:

Identified 10 High risk children from Golamunda block and 2 children from Lanjigarh block were referred to special program "Jivan Rekha" of Sardharaj Medical college Jaring, for emergency treatment by our special effort by our facilitators and all 10 Children were successfully treated by the specialist and got the medicine and 1 physically challenges child successfully surgical operation in his effected leg.

**Referred to High risk children to DEIC:** Identified 6 High risk children from Golamunda block were referred to District Early Intervention Centre (DEIC) by our facilitators and DEIC is recommended to these children for higher treatment at Cuttack and Burla Hospital and refer date has been already decided and one child already got this facilities.

**Ensure earthen pots for Birth Preparedness .** By the effort of our facilitators of Lanjigarh block 105 pregnant women were purchased mati sara (earthen pots) and started saving money for birth preparedness and out of 105 pregnant women 46 mothers were already used their saving money in delivery period. Advocacy through Samadhan : (the grievance mechanism of Kalahandi District) solved the many issues i.e Irregular of AWW, Pre -schooling, SNP, THR, drinking water facilities at AWC and delay payment of Mamata Yojana by the used of Samadhan

## Major Out Come:

- Post natal check up practice increased by 25 % in 80 villages.
- 7% increased the Nutritional level of Children ( As per baseline status 60% of children in Normal stage in the month of Sept-15 and now it is 67%)
- Institutional delivery increased to 20% in the 80 villages.( Present status 991 Institutional Delivery out 1376 ) Baseline : Institutional delivery : 52 % only.
- In-time immunization has benefitted 1805 new born children in last one year
- Communities and families particularly tribal/Dalit and most marginalized have improved access to quality information, counseling on MIYCN
- Increased health seeking behavior and consciousness towards early marriage and early pregnancy among tribal boys and girls.



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- Increased participation of the pregnant and lactating mothers at VHNDs (about 55%) have improved IYCN practices.
- Increased use of locally available foods and iodized salt by communities.
- Practice like early marriage has reduced in through parent counseling. Practices related to institutional delivery, IFA intake, regular immunization and ANCs have also improved.
- IYFC program through FFL video have enhanced communication skill of the frontline staffs and they are able to effectively handle situation for the well being of the community. Support to 760 families with pregnant / lactating mother & 3020 u - 5 age children have improved their dietary practice & micro nutrient food intake.



### “Impact of quality counseling”

Chandrakala Kand (33) of Village Goindimunda in Brundabahal Panchayat. She is illiterate and has no any type of information on health. Her elder daughter is now 15 years old. In between she was 4 time pregnancy but unfortunately all of the case was failure by abortion. Timely involvement of Seba Jagat volunteer and repeated counseling Chandrakala & her husband and also shown all the episode of Safe motherhood in the village. So Chandrakala and her family members saw all the episode and more influences after seen the FFL Video show and always received advice from our facilitator and ANM. Chandrakala consumed all 100 IFA tablets, 4 Time ANC and take proper diet and rest and planed to deliver the baby at Sub-division hospital, Dharmagr. Our Project staff, ANM and AWW of the village regular meets to the chandrakala and counseling regularly.



Chandrakala delivered a male child of 3.2 Kilograms in Dharmagarh hospital. Now the infant and mother both are well and as per our suggestion she has done early breast feeding and was not given anything other than breast milk.

She knows weight of her child now, which is very much important thing on the way to improve health status of children. She got information on immunization through FFL videos and adopting it. Now she knows the importance of immunization and time of each immunization session.





**Management of Primary Health Centre (New), Barabandha:**

Seba Jagat has been taken the management role of Barabandha Primary Health Centre (New) under Private Public partnership Programme with the support of National Rural Health Mission Odisha, since 12<sup>th</sup> June-2008. Barabandha is one inaccessible area of Kalahandi district. It covers 8719 population. One M.B.B.S Doctor, Ayush Doctor, pharmacist, ANM, Laboratory technician, Ward Attendant and Project Coordinator appointment by organization in PHC, (N) Barabandha. Around 38 villages under Barabandha Gram Panchayat and also nearest Gram Panchayat are depends this primary health Centre for their primary and emergency treatment.



**CLINICAL TREATMENT:**

**Provision of Medical Care:** With an existing team of MBBS Doctor, Paramedics, ANM, Lab. Technician, health volunteers the project is able to provide preventive, curative and preventive health services, The OPD is functioning 24X7 hours with alternative support of the allopathic doctor, Ayurvedic doctor and other paramedics. Every day more than 45 patients from nearby villages are visiting to this hospital for treatment.

**Outdoor Patient Diary (OPD):** Barabandha PHC(N) situated remote area of Kalahandi district, by the some efforts of volunteers of Seba Jagat the more patients come to PHC(N) for treatments. In the period April'16 to March'17 total 18344 no's of patients stepped in here during this month. Among of them, 7308 no's of male, 11036 no's of female, 2780 nos of male child, 2194 no's of female child patients were got treatment.

**AYUSH Outdoor Patient Diary (AYUSH OPD):** In reported year 5238 no's patients were registered, and get benefited by here by our Ayush Doctor. We also provided free Ayurvedic medicines which was supplied by N.H.M.

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**Achievement in Seba Jagat Health Programme :**

- 335 Adolescents girl from Golamunda and Boden project area were sanitation during menstrual hygiene and use of home based herbal sanitary napkin, Life Skill Education, Nutrition during adolescents period and emphasized the issues related to non availability of clean toilet facility in school, malaria and malnutrition .
- 120 AWWs and ASHAs of Golamunda and Boden project area were orientated on quality counseling and good communication and wide range of maternal health issues st arting from the risks involved in pregnancy and birth defect, on how to follow up post-natal cases and how do home based management of childhood care.
- Organized interface meeting with ICDS, Health Department at Golamunda and Boden block separately where 80 Community leaders, PRI members and village leaders were participated and shared the issues related to health and other services to mother and children and also discussed on the behavior change and its good impact on the community especially on pregnant , Lactating and under 2 Children. This resulted in positioning key message related to maternal and child nutrition among opinion makers of the communities.
- Formed 14 adolescents group in Boden and 6 adolescents group at Golamunda block and trained the group on health and hygienic, process of reduction of malnutrition, work against early marriage and created awareness on Govt. scheme and services for adole scents group and children.
- In collaboration with line department of Govt. Seba Jagat has been conducted the Kisory Day Celebration, Suravi programme, child right week etc and communities towards adolescence health, diet, anemic, Sanitation & mens truation hygiene, end early marriage etc
- Organized the Street Play on early child marriage and early pregnancy in our operational villages of Golamunda and Boden area where more than 1300 villagers watch the program and more influence towards stop early m arriage.



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**PREVENT EARLY MARRIAGE**

The story of these three girls are sounds same though they are unique. The ages of these three girls are about 14 to 15 yrs. They live with their family and helping to their parents in the household activity. When Rina completed 6<sup>th</sup> standard, Dhrubakanti left school in 7<sup>th</sup> and Jharana is still in school in 8<sup>th</sup> standard. When Rina and Dhrubakanti left school because of poverty Jharana was continuing with education with household work. With very less un irrigated agricultural land the families were mainly dependant on wage labour.

Because of poverty when there w as marriage proposal came they decided to do marriage as soon as possible without thinking of the legal age for girl's marriage and ignoring even their primary consent. The girls were though unhappy but could not do anything.

In the time of home visit by our Community Animator this matter came to the knowledge of Seba Jagat staff. They first discussed with the girls about



the matter and they reached to their home and tried to convince their parents for not conducting this marriage at the early age. But their father was not ready to accept the things. Then strategically Seba Jagat staff brought this matter to DCPO & CWC, Kalahandi and requested them to take some action without is closing their name. The DCPO took the matter very seriously and informed to the local police station. After that the police accompanied with CDPO, LS reached their family and stopped the marriage process. They even counseled their family regarding the ill effect of early marriage and legal offences for this matter and the possible punishment for the act. The families though were not very convinced but stopped the marriage until the girls are not



having the age of 18yr old.

This had become an eye opener in the area and other three marriages have stopped immediately. Though parents were initially were reluctant about the matter but slowly with a series of counseling are able to understand the mistake. But the whole act has given courage among teen age girls that nobody can force them to marry. Though people were aware about the lega marriageable age but they never thought that the administration and police can really take an action and after the preliminary ceremonies the marriage process can be stopped. These three girls have become example for others.

## EDUCATION

Enforcement of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RCFCE) Act 2009 has legalized the schooling right of children in the age group of 6 to 14 years. Still there are a great many issue at the ground level relating to the out -of-school children and ensuring age specific admission for them. The issues are much more prominent in the case of girls in the remote tribal areas. In these pockets, most of the girls are first generation learners and the parents and community members are hardly aware about the rights of the children in general and their right to education in particular.

Children have always been at the centre of Seba Jagat's programmes, a strategy that has worked very well to bring flagship programmes like Elementary Education in South Odisha, Child Development Program within the reach of these disadvantaged children. Creating awareness on rights among children, organizing them and equipping them with negotiation skills is embedded in the child-centric approach. In this context Seba Jagat, during the reporting year, undertaken several interventions to address these critical areas i.e running of Early child education centre, Education centre, IT Centre, Special Coaching Center for Upper Primary Student, running of Balwadi Centre and enhanced the capacity building program of children, communities, teachers and project staff.

### A timely decision – keep on education to a girl child.

Dumerbahal a village in Golamunda block of Kalahandi District and mostly the inhabitants are OBC and backward class. As the villagers are illiterate and ignorant, they do not have any interest in education of their children. As a result most of the children do not attend the school or discontinue at the early stage if admitted. Similarly Panchami Majhi daughter of Bhujabala Majhi is irregularly going to school from class IX. Now she is 14 years old. In the early days Panchami's attendance proved to be irregular and her attitude towards work a bit slow. Upon inquiring into her background and family thinking found that completely illiterate family did

not think education was important enough for anyone, particularly a girl to neglect her household routines. Rather it was felt that education would come in the way of house work and she stopped her annual examination. Her family had never considered education as an option since this was an idea completely distant to them. Community Animat of Child Development Project during regular home visit to help try and convince the parents about the importance of education and to explain to them that it could in fact change their lives forever. These external efforts not only succeeded in making Panchami even more determined to study in the face of opposition within her family, but finally also got the parents and other siblings to see the relevance of what Panchami was trying to be part of. Now Panchami not only goes regularly to school but also carries back homework with her. By the

or



impression of her hard work and sheer of determination Panchami has within a time frame successfully complete the class IX exams and has now moved on to class X in the local government school. As a result of this influence her younger brother has enrolled in the local school and her parents are now convinced about the significance of education within every family. Her parents recognize the fact if Panchami had not been so adamant about going to school her entire family would have remained in darkness.

**SPONSORSHIP** : Every child should get excellence and value rich education and a dignified life in order to contribute for the welfare of the society. In order to improve the quality of life and facilitate holistic development of all those children who are burdened under the clutches of poverty and misery, Seb Jagat through its Sponsorship program has made direct impact on life of the children. It has become a powerful agent of change in the life of 800 Children.

#### Major Achievement

- 368 school going sponsored children were supported with solar Lanten by the results they able to read and write during absent of electricity.
- 68 sponsored children have passed 10th exam with good marks and are into higher studies and different technical trainings.
- Migration has been reduced in 12 villages where 68 sponsored families have given up migrating and are engaged to MGNREGA activities and cultivation.





## LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMME

### Sustainable Option for uplifting Livelihood

Seba Jagat's livelihood programme focuses on enhancing household –level food and nutrition security, conserving the natural resources, facilitating them to access government social security benefits, strengthening community based organizations to participate in the local governance , build their capacities to undertake micro-level planning on local feasible livelihood option and expanding income opportunities for the rural poor in a sustainable manner. This is achieved through empowering people by increasing their knowledge base and capacitating them through skill building and facilitating access to resources.

### Capacity Building

Seba Jagat provides Capacity building support to the Community based organizations (CBOs), Village Action Team members, Small and marginal farmers with an aim to enable and empower them so that they themselves can take up the responsibility of implementing the sustainable option for uplifting livelihood programmes. Training on different themes such as drought resilient technology, crop planning, mixed cropping to enhance productivity of land, seed selection, seed priming, land preparation, germination test, use of organic, green manure and pest control, crop planning according to availability of water importance on millet, Promotion of grain bank and seed bank, different services and schemes from line dept and bank,



Training was also provided on land and water management, different social security schemes like PDS, pensions, rearing of animals, Agriculture and horticulture development, off-farm activities like poultry, Mushroom cultivation etc.

### Community Based Institutions

Community based institutions form the base for promoting livelihood interventions. The basic community level organizations at the village level are the Self Help Groups (SHGs), Village Action Team, Village development Committee and Youth Clubs are also promoted. The Focus this year was on empowering women members, Village Action Team to take a lead role in livelihood activities and assert their right over productive assets and access input and to different services related to livelihood programme.



### Sustainable Agriculture

Agriculture being one of the primary sources of livelihoods of the tribals, efforts are made by the organization to help them learn improved agricultural practices so that their crop production can increase which in turn can ensure year around food security and enhanced income for them. Improved practices such as line sowing, System of Rice Intensification (SRI), use of organic manures and pest management practices, improved variety of seeds, mixed cropping, crop rotation, community farming, kitchen gardening etc. are emphasized. This year, a total of 1145 acres of land were covered under improved agriculture in 10 villages of





Norla block in Kalahandi district focusing on different crops as reflected in the table below. Convergence with mainstream agencies and schemes such as the Horticulture, Agriculture, OLM, Department was ensured for better quality inputs and extension services.

**Training on organic cultivation:** Organic cultivation demonstrations training were organized at Boden Block during the current year. In the programme 10 farmers learnt about vermin compost, magic compost etc. After that there was an exposure visit to organic model centre, Villanger, SVA. After finishing the demonstration training 10 selected farmers were provided seeds and sprayer machine support for their encouragement.

### “Baidehi adopted only organic farming”

The village Kundeijharan is situated under Takarla GP of Narla block of Kalahandi district. Only 28 families are living in this small village. Among them most the families are belonging to tribal community. They live just hand to mouth.

Occupationally they depend on mostly on agriculture and collecting the minor forest products seasonally. Sometimes they do labour works. Due to non-irrigated area agriculture give very less production. They have to depend on rain water for cultivation. During drought situation they really get very less production from farming for which they suffer much to maintain their families.



Looking this situation Seba Jagat with the support of IGSSS discussed with the farmers of Takarla, Muskuti & Palam GPs and observed that the farmers cultivating their land in traditional methods applying hybrid seeds, chemical fertilizer, pesticide which fails for the shortage of water & attacked by the insects. They are totally un





know the appropriate technology of farming the land use techniques. So a series of training programs, demonstration and exposure program were continued at various places to change the motive of farmers towards agriculture development process on mixed crop, line sowing, use of local seed, green and organic manure, watering, weeding and harvesting process along with vegetable cultivation by using vermin compost & magic compost to get better production.

Smt. Baidehi Patra belonging to this village is living her husband having 2 sons & one daughter. Her husband is



an ordinary farmer & due to poverty maintaining the family is very painful. In this situation Baidehi started on Kitchen garden using the learning of technological training in cultivation and planned Brinjal, Tomato, Bitter guard and used magic compost & vermin compost. She totally avoid for chemical, fertilizer & pesticide. She herself surprised to look the production and showed others with motivating them to start the vegetable cultivation in this process

Baidehi consumed the vegetable at her home and sold the excess production which supported her for livelihood. Looking the good result with less investment, she decided to continue this process using more

land for better production and selling at local market. Sometimes the products are sold at her door step. At her impact other farmers have started the organic vegetable cultivation.

### Emergency Draught Response Programme :

Seba Jagat has implemented the Emergency Drought Action Program Supported by IGSSS in 8 need base villages of Palam, Muskuti and Takarla GPs under Narla Block of Kalahandi district in Odisha. We have created sustainable structures towards solution of severe water scarcity due to drought situations especially during every summer season. Now it is hopeful that the water bodies/Structures will help to save crops, create agricultural employments, reduction of migration, and reduction of heavy burden to collect water from distance places for their domestic use as well as for their pet animals along with to solve many other related problems.

### Adibashi Traditional Rights and livelihood Programme

Seba Jagat has been implementing the Adibashi Traditional Rights and Livelihood in forty villages of M.Rampur and Baliguda block of Kalahandi and Kondhamal district respectively. This project mainly focuses on the improvement of livelihood status of Adivasi community and to ensure their basic rights through implementation of different Govt. programs and policy including implementation of FRA/CFR and other livelihood based programs

#### Major Achievements: (Results/targeted achievements)

- 22 Villages got CFR Right and 10 villagers were re-submitted community claim to SDLC and also 27 IFR title has been given to 27 Adivasi families with 42 Acres of forest land in 7 villages
- Highlighted of different programs in local printed and electronic media.
- More than 3000 Adivasi and Banabasi people had participated in Rindo Majhi Mela and they shared their Problem before the local leaders and Govt officials.
- It has reached 1000 Project area village community leaders, District authority and other well-wishers and they are aware on different information's, issues, different govt. scheme and also shared their experience in this platform.
- 12 Adivasis leader from our project area attend different state level and national Level Programme held at Ranchi, Delhi, Bhubaneswar, Raipur and enhanced the knowledge on FRA, thematic issue and Adivasis life style





- 52 community leaders were enhanced the knowledge on different aspects of traditional intercropping system, value addition so that, 66 no of family are developed yam cultivation in this year.
- 84 Families from 11 Villages developed fruits orchard i.e Papaya, Lemun, Drumstick and Mango plants and which give livelihood support for their family.
- The Traditional Herbal practitioners were shared their experience , success towards cure different disease, challenges etc in monthly meeting and the members were participating in district, state and national level program, attending different exhibition and demonstrated the herbal medicine and also developed a herbal garden by the efforts of all members.
- Developed Vermi Compost, Handi Khat and traditional compost pit by 27 families in 8 villages. 112 Families from 10 villages are Promoted Nutritional Garden and are using organic compost in this farming.
- Development of Boucher on Raggi Specials (written about different products of Raggi for other knowledge) and distributed to the community. Eco village meeting have been and discussed on Regeneration of forest, Shifting cultivation, Organic farming, Development of Agriculture. Rearing of domestic animals, Opposing for mining, Keep up traditional culture, Sustainable development, Utilization of water sources etc. The people appreciated and took part in the discussion. Now they have taken the proper initiative to build their villages as ideal one with active cooperation of all families. They have documented their village resources and proposed plan for Ecovillage-development



- Eco-village development in 24 villages in the 8 districts through 12 partner organization. Development of Biodiversity registered of 10 villages. Organized 3 meeting on Ecovillage and CFR at Kalahandi. Advocacy on CFR and Community Forest Governance in 10 districts of the State.
- Observed the world environment day at Burat in which 86 participants from Adivasi groups, School/college students, Women, Lawyers. Magistrate of M.Rampur Court were participated and discussed in this topic and the role and responsibilities of each people in this context.



- 15 farmers Developed Fruits orchard by the support of Horticulture department, 2. Solary pump sets has been linked to two potential farmers of Jurakhaman village which is helping them for the promotion of double cropping in near about four acres of land.

## YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

On the occasion several activities such as Cycle Rally, Sankirtan in villages, song competition, dance dhamaka etc were organized. Floral tributes were offered by the guests on the photo of Swami Vivekananda and the guests inaugurated all events and distributed prizes to the winners. A meeting was also held highlighting the importance of the day for the youths.



**Training to youth on govt. schemes and services:** 250 Youth from 38 villages of Golamunda & Boden block provided training on govt. schemes and services i.e MGNREGA, Antadoya, Mo Kudia, Swarnajayanti swa rojagara Yajana, RTI, RTE, Dhanajana Yojna, Mamata yojna, NRHM, NRLM etc so that they enhanced knowledge about these scheme and services and monitoring it's for proper implementation in their area.

### Livelihood input support to DEV (Deprive Exclusive Vulnerable)youth.

In support of ChildFund India and Seba Jagat 10 youth has provided Goats support in Golamunda Block and each individual have received 4 goats including buck, 6 youth has provided poultry support in Boden Block and 10 youth has provided seeds & sprayer machine support to have their sustainable livelihood and financial improvement in Golamunda and Boden Block.



### Skill training to Youth

33 youth have provided skill training in Boden and Golamunda Block. Out of 33 youth 17 girls have provided 3 month tailoring training and 16 youth have provided one month driving. After training the youth have received tailoring certificate and driving licence.

### Establishment of YRC.

04 nos of YRC established in Putupada, Amguda, Tetelpada, Temri village of Boden Project Intervention Area. 49 youth registered on youth resources centre and get benefitted thru YRC activities and get involved in their carrier building, village development, and youth collective. Provide Disel Pump, Dari and Different Megazine. Youth are using that material.



### Training to Youth on Entrepreneurship Development Programme and Business Plan.

Organised EDP training programme at Dharmagara where 50 DEV youth have participated in the programme and prepared business plan.

**Skill building program for rural youth:**

A total of 105 dropout youth were equipped with vocational skill such as, driving training, cell phone repairing, electrician and garment making training in our operational area M. Rampur and Baliguda block. Out of them, 23 male and 8 female youth have got employed and 49 male and 22 female self employed in this period. In order to support the trainees we have chalked out follow up plan towards placement, bank linkages for employment / self employment, marketing of products etc.

During this programme PRA exercises are organized ten no of the selected villages from M.Rampur block Kalahandi district in Odisha to invite the community participation and ownership, and also to know the socio-economic, cultural and political situations, understanding of available resources, role of institutions, various stakeholders and their role in the decision making etc. in the process of implementation of SCOPE model.

**Dream Comes True**

Punjastala Bagarty (Punja) is a 20 year old girl from Palam village in Narla block of Kalahandi district. She is living with her father, mother, younger brother and sister. Punja is the elder child in the family. Belonging to a poor family, going to school has not been easy task either, however, with a supportive family Punja studied till 8<sup>th</sup> standard. But her inner urge to learn never really died down and she has thought to do some work and give financial support to family by additional income.

While she came to know Seba Jagat is continue Garment making training at Palam village in support of Functional Vocational Training & Research Society (FVTRS), Bangalore, she applied and selected for thi trade. Punja and another 14 girls were got 4 months training program in her village..Punja has completed Garment Making Training





successfully.

After 4 months of training, Punja is being able to making varieties of dresses i.e school dress, shirt, trousers, traditional wear, blouse, sara, frock, salwar kurti etc After completion of training she continued that work in a tailoring shop of her village. Now she is getting Rs.3500.00 per month as honorarium and supporting her family.

She is now the example for the village and unemployment youth mass for their area. Her parents are quite happy for the activities of their elder daughter Punja. They also praised the effort of Seba Jagat by which Punja could able to Support them. She helped her family from her income and Saved Rs.1000.00 per month regularly. By the inspiration of Punja, her 2 associates are also joined in the Garment Making shop where Punja is working. Today Punja is a happy person and her dream for securing an employment on sustainable basis, her dream come true.



### **Addressing nutritional and income Insecurity of the underprivileged communities by Improving access to Relevant Govt Schemes**

The major focus of the project is to ensure active community participation in local governance for the effective planning of services. Particularly focus is on the health, nutrition, child development, education and employment generation sectors, as these have a direct and tangible impact on well being and will also be confidence building measures for local community demand for accountability in other sectors..

The programme addressed the following aspects:

- Increased access to public services;
- Improved quality of public service delivery;
- Transparency of public service schemes and budget allocations enhanced;
- Enhanced quality of life with improved access;
- Better local governance with increased people's participation,
- Advocacy and up scaling of the action, benefiting all tribal areas of the state.

- Strengthening of Village level committees relating health , nutrition and education
- Developing Block, District level committees
- Organising interface, discussion with line dept
- Strengthening local governance with ensuring women participation
- Developing Block Information Centre

### **PRIORITIZING HEALTH IN LEGISLATIVE SPACES**

Seba Jagat with the support of CYSD and National Foundation of India (NFI). NFI has started in working towards prioritizing health through engagement with elected representatives. The idea behind this multi-pronged approach is to create a critical understanding within the community and elected representatives dedicated to improving the health status of their respective constituencies. It is expected that health will be prioritized for discussions in policy circles. The activities have been around Perception study on basic health facilities at PHC and CHC level in areas of intervention. Real time data tracking of health issues among target communities through Swasthya Pratham Mobile Vanni. There was a round table discussion with the legislators was organized during the assembly session. This was attended by 15 MLAs from different parties, government officials and civil society organisations.

### **FoGGO (Forum for Green Governance Odisha)**

Seba Jagat initiated the network FoGGO where 12 Organizations part of the process from 10 districts of Odisha state committed to for the cause of ecological security. The major activities of the network revolves around

- Capacity building of various stakeholders on Green Governance and ecological security from community to state level.
- Organizing and attending meetings, workshops, seminars and conferences on different climate change issues, and impacts on human being and nature, and possible ways and means for mitigation and adaptation.

- Influence policies and programs from state to international level, networking with likeminded forums and groups on climate change issues affecting the communities directly and indirectly.
- Strengthening and enhancing the capacity of SHGs/Women groups/Forums focusing Women's central role in development and work towards gender equity.

The partner organization in the reporting period in 250 villages initiated the process of Community Forest Rights with the following activities

- Identification of potential villages where CFR process taken up after conducting preliminary survey.
- Facilitate conduct of Pallisabha and constitutional /reconstitution of forest right committee in the village /hamlet/habitation.
- Facilitate preparation of forest rights claims document involving demarcation of traditional boundary, proper filling up of Form B and C, collection of evidence , etc
- Facilitate Joint verification of CFR claim made FRC.
- Facilitate conduct of pallisabha for consideration and approval of CFR claim made by FRC
- Facilitate conduct of Pallisabha for consideration and approval of CFR claim.

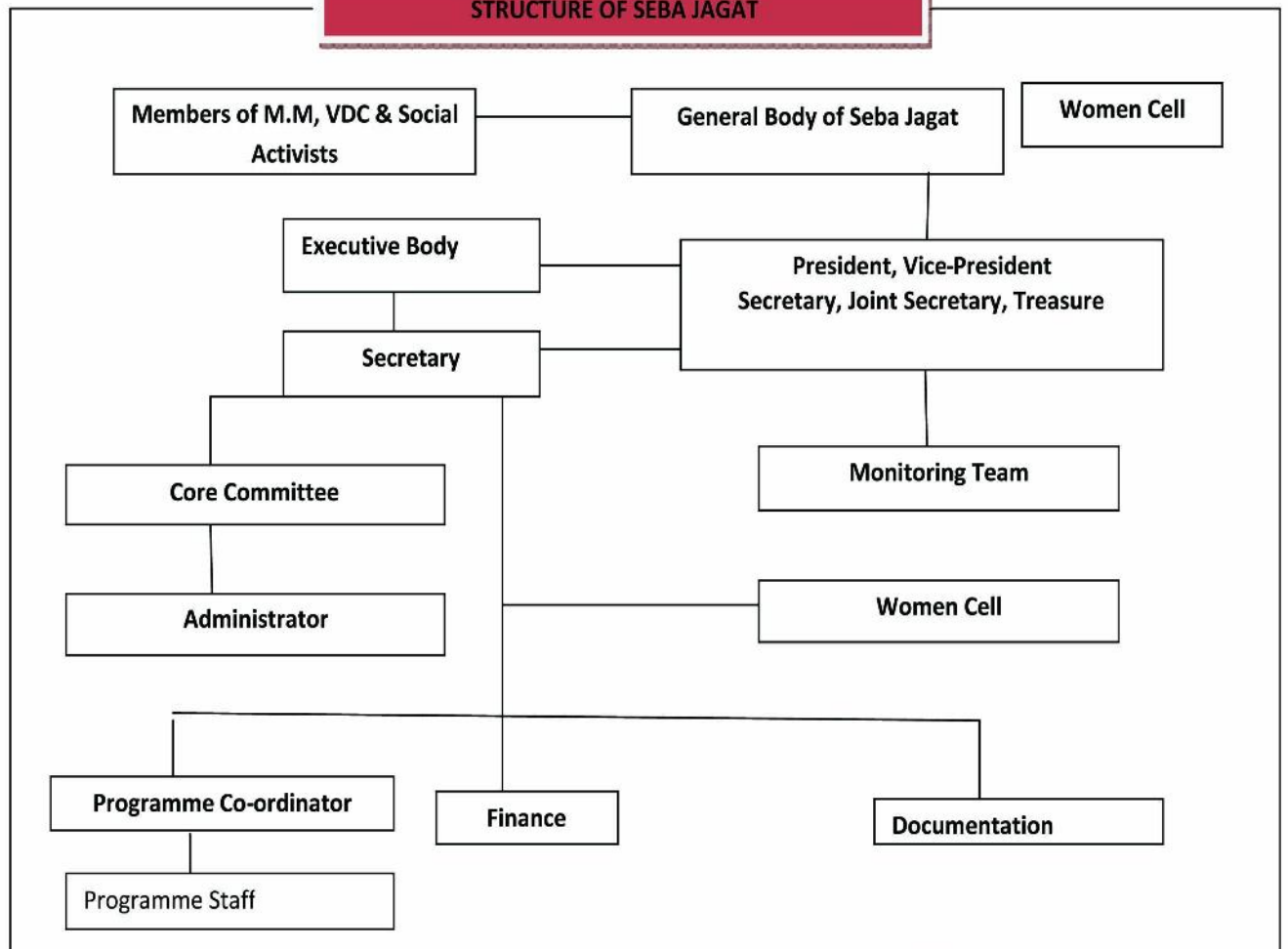

**STRUCTURE OF SEBA JAGAT**

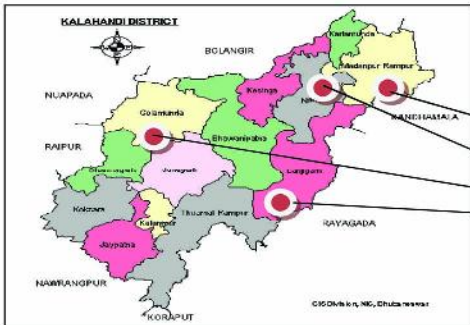
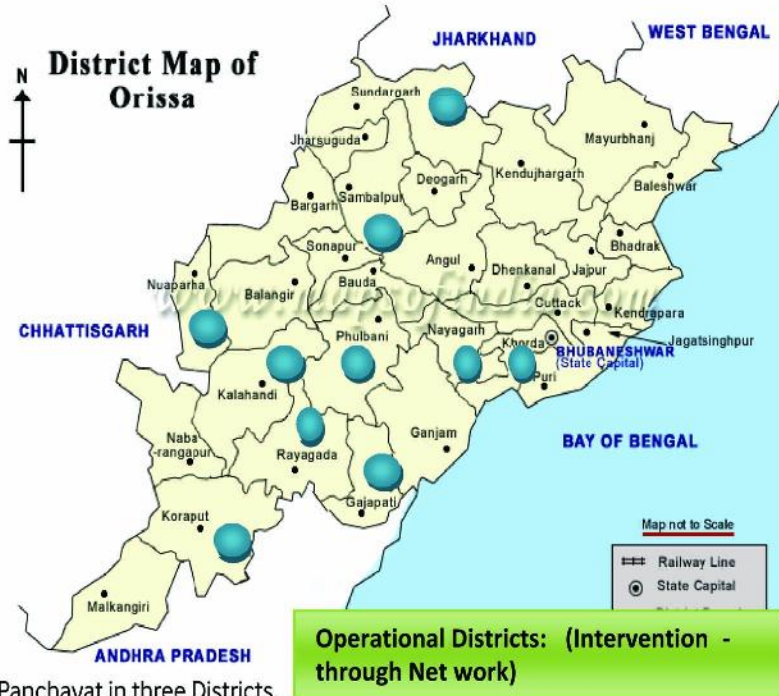




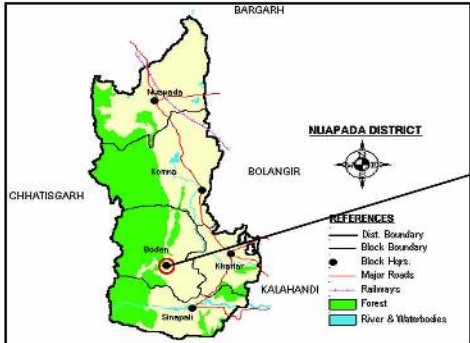
**OPERATIONAL AREA AND COVERAGE**

The operational area of Seba Jagat is located at the southern western, the most backward region, of Odisha. It covers three districts, Viz, Kalahandi, Nuapada and Kandhamal. At present, Seba Jagat is working in 6 Blocks i.e. M.Rampur, Lanjigarh, Narla and Golamunda of Kalahandi Districts, Boden block of Nuapada District and Baliguda Block of Kandhamal District of Orissa State and Indirect intervention in 9 Districts in Odisha with the Forum of Green Governance of odisha

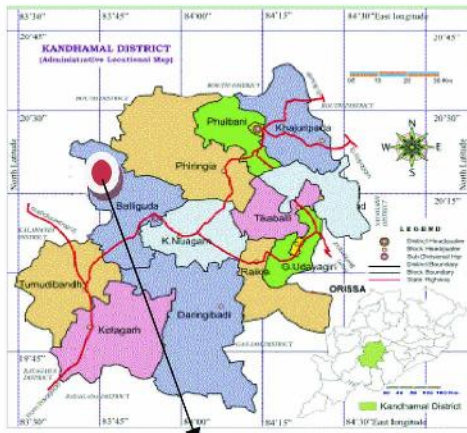
The Head Office of Seba Jagat M. Rampur is 378 kms distance from state capital Bhubaneswar and 55 kms from the district headquarter Bhawanipatna. The cluster office of Seba Jagat is located at Kumarguda ( Lakhbahali G.P) & Musanal of Lanjigarh Block, Limser of Golamunda Block, Rangapadar of Utladani GP & Burat of M.Rampur block, Khariar of Nuapada District and Sudra of Baliguda Block in Kandhamal District. It has been covering total 23126 families out which 12215 ST, 4502 SC & 8514 families are belonging to the Other Backward caste under 425 Villages over 37 Gram Panchayat in three Districts. Areas of Seba Jagat i.e Intervention through network and direct intervention in Kalahandi, Kandhamal & Nuapada Dist.
