A. Infant and Young Child Feeding and Maternal Nutrition

Seba Jagat in order to bring growth and development of children through strengthened communication skill of the frontline health care providers has been implementing the program in 250 remote villages of Lanjigarh, Golamunda and Narla blocks in Kalahandi District.

With the basic intention to strengthen the communication and facilitation skills of frontline functionaries through participatory communication practices, the intervention focused on bringing about behavior change towards Maternal Infant Young Child Feeding (MIYCF) practices at individual, family and community level. Secondly, the intervention also identified critical stakeholders and ensured an interface with these different stake holders at regular intervals it support the process of normative change amongst communities. Orientation meetings with frontline functionaries like Anganwadi workers, ASHAs, ANMs, and village facilitators at regular interval have generated learning and behavioral change practices amongst communities' members. Simultaneously, meeting with members of tribal samaj, traditional healers and panchayat functionaries on their traditional practices like child marriage and its negative effects is slowly bringing new consciousness among them. Interactive sessions with adolescents in schools, participation at VHND, information sharing with ASHAs during monthly cluster meetings have helped to improve awareness levels of community and communication skills of frontline functionaries.

The Fact for Life (FFL) video programmes for primary and secondary stakeholders (pregnant women, lactating others, adolescent girls and family members) supported to generated demand amongst community and willingness to change for better.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

District-level training of trainers :

This pool of master trainers consisted of ICDS supervisors, NGO supervisors and facilitators, faculty from AWTC and district officials from WCD and Health. These master trainers were trained on MIYCN, maternal nutrition, communication skills and use of the innovative communication tools - FFL videos and mobisodes. A pool of 55 master trainers was created under the project through three-day district-level training and refresher programmes.



Training of middle and frontline functionaries:

The retention of messages and understanding of new tools learnt through this training were assessed during the period of implementation from time-to-time by NGO supervisors and facilitators. From the monitoring visit reports and sector meeting reports it was seen that, out of 214 AWWs and ASHA, around 187 (87%) were able to use the communication tools to conduct IPC sessions and counselling. It was seen that 108/214 AWWs and ASHA (50%) were able to recall key communication methods taught during the trainings. And 154/



214 FLWs i.e AWWs and ASHA (72%) showed good skills to engage communities in discussion. It was seen that 18/40 ANMs (45%) could recall key correct messages related to MIYCN

Interface with Tribal Samaj and Dalit Samaj :

These interface sessions with Tribal Samaj and Dalit samaj were useful in highlighting critical issues of child and women's nutrition among leaders of the community.

During the interface session, the tribal leaders were informed about the FFL video shows and their involvement was sought in monitoring service delivery and counselling by FLWs. In some project areas, their support was also sought for taking the FFL videos to non-intervention villages.

Village level Implementation of IPC Sessions :

It was seen through monitoring visits of Seba Jagat project staff that 162(84%) out of 192 AWWs were conducting counselling during VHND and RI. Of these, 105(55%) were found to be using the communication tools to conduct IPC sessions and home visits. Of these 138 AWWs (71%) demonstrated skills to engage communities in discussion. Additionally 45 (30%) out of 148 ASHAs and 18/40 ANMs (45%) observed were seen to use the communication tools to conduct IPC and home visits.



One day orientation to 56 newly elected Panchayat functionaries :

72 % PRI members/ leaders able to recall key IYCF messages and 62 % initiating dialogue on MIYCN during community meetings



Training to community stake holder's i.e adolescent's girls and Youth :

Two days training provided to 494 to communities stakeholders – adolescents girls & Youth on communication skill using mobisodes 52 % Communities stakeholders adolescents girls and Youth initiating dialogue on MIYCN during community meetings/VHND session and strengthening community awareness on critical issues of health and nutrition and also provided Key messages on health and nutrition were disseminated through the medium of FFL videos which helped in attracting the community's attention and interest. Participatory methods of communication were used by these groups.



Project Concept Sharing and lesson learnt workshop with District Administration;

Shared about the project, major outcome , impact level indicators, success etc in the presence of district Collector cum District Magistrate, Kalahandi Odisha, Line department official's i.e DSWO, CWC members, DCPO, CDPO from our operational area, NGO functionaries, Media people and the representative from UNICEF-Odisha.



Community awareness : It was also observed that there was improvement in community involvement in health and

nutrition services. Women were seen to be asking more questions and interacting more frequently with AWW. There was also demand for videos on more topics like THR, egg, immunization etc. 52% mothers and care givers of children under two able to recall key messages received during counseling and IPC sessions, 45 % mother able to tell color code of their children weight status.. 78 % target beneficiaries attending VHND session/ group counseling using the FFL videos.

B. Management of Primary Health Centre (New), Barabandha:

Seba Jagat has been taken the management role of Barabandha Primary Health Centre (New) under Private Public partnership Programme with the support of National Rural Health Mission Odisha, since 12th June-2008. Barabandha is one inaccessible area of Kalahandi district. It covers 8719 population. One M.B.B.S Doctor, Ayush Doctor, pharmacist, ANM, Laboratory technician, Ward Attendant and Project Coordinator appointment by organization in PHC, (N) Barabandha. Around 38 villages under Barabandha Gram Panchayat and also nearest Gram Panchayat are depends this primary health Centre for their primary and emergency treatment.



CLINICAL TREATMENT :

Provision of Medical Care : With an existing team of MBBS Doctor, Paramedics, ANM, Lab. Technician, health volunteers the project is able to provide preventive, curative and preventive health services, The OPD is functioning 24X7 hours with alternative support of the allopathic doctor, Ayurvedic doctor and other paramedics . Every day more than 45 patients from nearby villages are visiting to this hospital for treatment.

Barabandha PHC(N) situated remote area of Kalahandi district, by the some efforts of volunteers of Seba Jagat the more patients come to PHC(N) for treatments. In the period April'17 to March'18 total 20373 no's of patients stepped in here during this month. Among of them, 8270 no's of male, 7112 no's of female, 2732 nos of male child, 2259 no's of female child patients were got treatment.

In reported year **7520** no's patients were registered , and get benefited by here by our Ayush Doctor. We also provided free Ayurvedic medicines which was supplied by N.H.M.

C. SABALA Programme

Seba Jgat have successfully implemented SABALA programme in M.Rampur block with the support of Women and Child Development Department, Govt. of odisha in collaboration with DSWO, Kalahandi and ICDS M. Rampur block.

The objective of the program is strengtheing of the existing the Kishori Samoohs & Sakhi Saheli in each village of block and increase their participation in NHED, Improve the life skill education, behaviours change and enhance knowledge on public service among the adolescents girls.

Sakhi Saheli Training -

Conducted 3 nos of Sakhi Saheli Training to 125 adolescents girls of Madanpur,Urladani and M.Rampur GPs of M.Rampur block at Rajeeb Gandhi Seba Kendra and oriented about adolescent health and development, Safe motherhood, Sanitation, Govt welfare Scheme for adolescent Girls, children and women, role and responsibility of Sakhi saheli and promotion of health environment.





Life skill Development :

Provided 2 nos. life skill training to 122 dolescents girls of Barabandha and ManikeraGPs of M. Rampur block and enhanced knowledge on Life Skill education i.e adolescents health and sanitaion practices, behaviors change through life skill, knowledge, attitude and skill, Major life decision, decision making, creative thinking, effective communication, empathy, interpersonal skill, coping with emotion and stress, Food and nutrition for adolescents etc. Now they are playing a positive role towards progress of other adolescents girls of their area and able to built a healthy life among themselves.

E. EDUCATION

Enforcement of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RCFCE) Act 2009 has legalized the schooling right of children in the age group of 6 to 14 years. Still there are a great many issue at the ground level relating to the out-of-school children and ensuring age specific admission for them. The issues are much more prominent in the case of girls in the remote tribal areas. In these pockets, most of the girls are first-generation learners and the parents and community members are hardly aware about the rights of the children in general and their right to education in particular.



Children have always been at the centre of Seba Jagat's programmes, a strategy that has worked very well to bring flagship programmes like Elementary Education in South Odisha, Child Development Program within the reach of these disadvantaged children. Creating awareness on rights among children, organizing them and equipping them with negotiation skills is embedded in the child-centric approach. In this context Seba Jagat, during the reporting year, undertaken several interventions to address these critical areas i.e running of Early child education centre, Education centre, IT Centre, Special Coaching Center for Upper Primary Student, running of Balwadi Centre and enhanced the capacity building program of children, communities, teachers and project staff.

F. School and Community Science Programme

The school and community science programme supported by the TATA TRUST and TCS Foundation under the South Odisha Initiative Programme is operational in the Lanjigarh Block of Kalahandi district. The core objective of the program is to develop Scientific Temperament among the 2649 students of 10 High school and 08 Upper primary school across 11 Gram Panchayats of Lanjigarh Block by Block Science Coordinator.

Mobile Science Van Launching and objective sharing at District Level:

The District Level Mobile Science Van Launching was organized at Collectorate Bhawanipatna on Date- 30th June 2017 in the presence of District collector, Kalahandi, Shree Dibya Sankar Mishra, MLA Junagarh, Shree Dhaneswar Majhi, MLA Narla, Satya Narayan Pattanayak, SEBA JAGAT, and Mr. Jiten Nayak & Mr. Pradipta Sundaray TATA TRUST, D.E.O., All B.E.Os, All CRCs, Govt. Teachers of Lanjigarh Block and Others Govt. And Non-govt. Officials, all implementing partners and Print and Electronic Media were present in the launching programme. Mr. Jiten Nayak address all about the objective of the Mobile Science Van, Mr. Pradipta Sundaray address all about the working model of van. Then Hon'ble collector and MLA officially inaugurate the Mobile Science Van by showing Flag.

Summer Camp Activities: - In May and June 2017 science van move to different school for summer camp activities. In summer camp we mostly focus on Arvind Gupta's low cost no cost toys making and science behind that is taught to children.

National Library Day Celebration:- A awareness rally programme was organised in Musanal Village with Musanal PUP School students, the objective of that programme is to aware the value books in our daily life, community members were also participated and browse different types of books.

Community Awareness Rally:- A Community awreness rally programme on Malaria was organised at Chancharapada of Bandhpari Gram Panchayat by Maa Bhairabi banabasi High School,Bandhpari Students, the objective of this programme is to aware the villagers for defend them from malaria, by using mosquito net at the time of sleeping, using lim oil,using proper diagnosis of their body, not belief on Superstation and consult with Doctor or ANM.

Watching Chief Minister Speech Programme on Live: - A Panchayat Level live Speech programme of Chief Minister Of Odisha on the eve of children's day was jointly organised with Gram Panchayat office,Lanjee, Education Department and Seba Jagatat at Panchayat High School,Musanal. More than 500 students, teachers of different schools of Lanjee Grampanchayat and other youth were participated in this programme.





Watching Blue Blood Super Moon:-

A Telescopic Programme was done in the Residential school of Bandhapari PUPS in presence of SMC member, Teachers, villagers and students. On that programme the blood blue super moon was shown through Telescope and Projector Screening. That was remarkable programme in Lanjigarh Block, more than 400 peoples and students were participated in this programme.



IMPACT ON SYSTEM LEVEL

- Some Teachers are started adapting Our Science Kit during Classroom transaction.
- Students are also demanding and requesting their teachers for Topic basis Practical.
- Teachers Training was more helpful for our Programme. Because the oriented teachers doing that Practical with their students.
- Other Uncovered Schools (Science Van) were demanding and requesting us for visit their school.

KEY ACHIVEMENT-

- Till date 83nos of leading students formatted.
- Out of them 23rd no's of students were done Preparatory class two times.
- Increases Community participation during Community Programme as comparison to previous day Programme.
- Community interest also seen. Like when we conducted first community programme in a village we requested all to come to us...but now they come with their own and doing sitting arrangement for other.



I. LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMME

Sustainable Option for uplifting Livelihood

Seba Jagat's livelihood programme focuses on enhancing household-level food and nutrition security, conserving the natural resources, facilitating them to access government social security benefits, strengthening community based organizations to participate in the local governance, build their capacities to undertake micro-level planning on local feasible livelihood option and expanding income opportunities for the rural poor in a sustainable manner. This is achieved through empowering people by increasing their knowledge base and capacitating them through skill building and facilitating access to resources.



Major Achievement:

Convergence program with Soil Conservation/ Agriculture department on land development: 02

Convergence organized with Soil Conservation/ Agriculture department, In both the programs 65 participants joined & participated. after training the participants directly consulted with departmental officials and approached for their provisional support. As a result so far obtained 20 cross bound amounting Rs. 200000/-, 4 farm ponds amounting Rs. 600000/-, Land developing in 4 villages has been done around Rs. 240000/- spent and 30 farmers got this opportunity.



Departmental officials of agriculture and soil conservation visited the area. The process is going on. The farmers are hopeful they will obtain more before the monsoon brakes.

Demonstration of zero energy cooling chamber : 01 low cost Traditional Cooling Chamber has been demonstrated at Rendabahali village. The vegetable sellers, vegetable hawkers are having started the process and getting the scope of this opportunity to keep their vegetable somehow fresh. Earlier they had to bear a great loss for dry vegetable now they are in better stage. They all felt the importance of zero energy cooling chambers which need to keep the vegetable in safe & green.

Technical support and demonstration of vermin compost and magic compost : 02 numbers of Vermin Compost Demonstration at Raidunipadar & Kundeijharan villages of Takarla GP. So that community have started managing the process. The size of the tank is 6' Length, 4' height, 4' wide tank dug. It is observed that the community have started the management of vermin compost preparation tank using their learning from the demonstration. The utility of both the composting were discussed by the technical persons. The interested beneficiaries continued their effort and the CBO/VAT and GP level Pressure Group continued their advocacy role towards availing the scope of converging program from MGNREGA on digging of Vermin compost Pits. Frequent contact and approach gained sanction for construction of 10 Vermin Compost Pits. The cost norms of digging of vermin compost Pits (20"x10") is Rs.20, 000/-. The selected and sanctioned stake holders are already started the works.



Interface meeting among VAT & newly elected 3 tire Panchayat Raj representative : interface meeting have been conducted at Palam GP headquarters. The VAT members shared their experiences on delay



process of availing the schemes where the newly elected PRI have assured to support for easy availing the benefits. However it is observed that the newly elected PRI representatives are shown their interest to access the benefits of the different antipoverty schemes by the eligible families without delay. Due to the support & cooperation of PRI representatives it will activate promptly.

Skill building training on processing, value addition and collective marketing :

The participants learnt the process of value addition on different products and how value addition give more price with little intervention. Secondly collective marketing has a good quality that everybody get equal rate & pricing. However the participants assure to take the opportunity of value addition & collective marketing. During this season the Villagers of Kundeijharan marketed about 80 quintal @ 2200/- which cost is Rs. 176000/- mahua flower as group norms. They also sold chahar Quintal 3 @ 3500/- amounting Rs. 18000/- and they are processing tol which will sold in group process in higher rate.

The villagers of Raidhunipadar sold about Q 160 mahua flower @2200/- amounting Rs. 352000/-. Q 60 chahar @ 3500/- which cost is Rs. 210000/-. Tol collection & processing is going on which will be sold in community in higher price.

Similarly at Rendabahali the villagers got 242000/- by selling Q 110 of mahua flower @ 2200/-. Tol collection and processing is under process. At earlier they were selling individually and cheated sometimes they sold at barter system in return of grains specially rice

Demonstration on integrated farming on constructed/renovated water harvesting structure :

Before 1 week of implementing of Pisciculture the water harvesting structure has been tested and according to the recommendation, 15 kg of stone lime has been thrown in the water body. 3 kg of spawn in different kinds such as Rohi, Bhakuda, & Mirikal, one kg of each variety has thrown. The feeding process has been started. The dehisced Paddy & Maize, Tol Pidia, wastage food items of animals & night soil etc. are provided according to the advice of fishery dept. The growth monitoring of spawn is being done on monthly basis. Consultation and interaction with fishery departments is done with the fishery department at intervals towards better rearing process. By which 22 family will get the benefit.



30 no's of mango, papaya, lemon, drumstick & banana has been planted on bonds of the structure Kalam plants are put inside water which will used as food for fish. SHG mothers have rearing Cock & duck. The ducks wander in the structure and eat away the harmful insects which help towards growth of both fish & duck.

All these things are managed and monitored by the VAT & SHG members of Rendabahali village to get better result through integrated farming & climate change affairs.

Now 2.5 quintal different fish sold @ Rs. 150 per kg by the CBO/VAT



Demonstration on rain shelter vegetable:

A suitable plot of 05 dismil with well communicated area has been finalised at Raidhunipadar village. A rain shelter has been build with wood and bamboo covered by polythin. Tomato saplings were planted inside the shed which is protected from direct rain water. The plants are growing well and now it is flowering stage.



Due to active participation and nice cooperation of VAT & SHGs members this programme could success and it may be replicated by other farmers even outside villages in next rainy seasons.

Formation and strengthening of Panchayat level presser group :

02 numbers of Panchayat level presser group Formation and strengthening at Takarla and Palam GP The main thrust of this group is strong advocacy with different govt. Departments at block level and district level to get the provisional rights by appropriate & eligible persons without longer delay process. A team of 20 active members were selected as GP level pressure group unanimously.

Follow up the previous micro plan and revised the micro plan on climate change and DRR :

During this period we have been able to followed up previous 10 micro plan The micro plans are revised as due process inclusive of climate change & DRR components with the active participation and need based suggestions of concerned village people. The 10 Micro Plan approved the Gram Sabha and submitted the Gram Panchayat office after revised the Micro Plan.



Orientation & capacity building on specific land less families with group :

30 land less families found very attentive and interested to involve possible activities with group attempt which strengthen their better livelihood. As per our observation 25 persons have procured 20 quintals of different crops for value addition and marketing in better prising. Now in the production period the agricultural crops are plentifully available with cheaper rate. Similarly 3 SHG groups are collecting broom sticks which can sell at local market after binding the broom. 3 Groups are already started collection and stitching of leaf plate & leaf cups which has been demanded at Hotels and Dhaba apart from marriage & other festivals. More over groups are preparing raggi packets, Guruji, Mustard, Mug, Black gram etc for selling at Kalahandi Ustav and Makara Mela.

PRA exercise with selective CBOs, VAT & Village leaders :

220 interested farmers from 6 villages of Takarla and Palam GP prepared the possible crop calendar basing on the climate change situation and looking the irrigation facilities and depending on rain water. The participants' focused towards some strategically activities in the planning to involve all category of people in the community those can grow up wards developmental process. This is an emerge and attractive exercise which touch every persons heart and opened the eye towards development og all community.



Exposure for selective CBO/VAT :

15 no of CBO/VAT including potential & progressive farmers for the exposure trip to SAMBHAB, Nayagarh, Odisha and they are enhanced the process of seed collection, procurement & storage system of the agricultural products. However the participants learnt a lot during their exposure visit and gained the practical knowledge. After returning 10 interested farmers started the learning process which learnt from SAMBHAB and sharing with other interested farmer to follow this process so that they will be more benefited.



“Good understanding could change in Variety of Crops:”

Madanpur is a tribal populated village comes under Muskuti GP of Narla Block in the Kalahandi, Odisha. About 78 families are residing here. The main occupations of the villagers are cultivation. Sometimes they collect minor forest produces from the forest towards their better livelihood.

Since long period they have been cultivating cotton about 120 acres of their cultivable land and other 40 acres they used to cultivate other crops. In cotton they have to invest a lot of money and in return they hardly get a little more profit according to their investment. Too much chemical fertilizer, pesticide and labour cost is badly require without which cotton production is not possible. Besides this the soil condition of their cotton land becomes worse. They could not understand the demerit of cotton cultivation. The economic condition of cotton farmers gradually became low.



Looking this situation SOUL Project staff discussed this matter seriously in the VAT meetings. With the support of VAT, the cotton cultivation farmers were called off for PRA (Participatory Rural Appraisal) and deeply analysis the findings regarding their investment including their labour cost. All the participants felt that cotton cultivation gives them minimum profit than other crops. Previously they were motivated many times discouraging them against cotton cultivation but all the time the cotton cultivators argued that that the cotton cultivation gives them good profit without marketing problem. Now the PRA analysis changed their thought. This year more farmers turned their regular cotton cultivation to maize & vegetable cultivation which investment is too less and their soil condition remain suitable for maize cultivation. They have suspect for good marketing as they have cultivating it for the first time. The VAT is giving them assurance to give marketing support for the maize cultivators. It has been calculated that more than 110 acres of land have been cultivated maize and vegetable this year in this village. We have visited maximum maize & vegetable plots and it gives us successful indication for more profit according to their investment. Some other cotton cultivators are looking eagerly regarding the benefit of this year cultivators and we hope more land will be used in maize & vegetable cultivation in coming years and the economical condition of these cultivators will be raised which will support them towards their better livelihood.

It is a challenging effort of farmers to change the way of cultivation from cotton to maize & vegetable which are also profitable without losing the soil fertility of their land.



Infrastructure for Climate Resilience Growth Project

SEBA JAGAT in partnership with IPE Global, DFID and Govt of Odisha has started pilot project on Infrastructure for Climate Resilience Growth Project in Kalahandi districts particularly in 6 Blocks i.e. Narla, Golamunda, Kesinga, Lanjigarh, Bhawanipatna & Karlamunda.

Objective of the Project:

1. Conducted training on climate resilience approach selection of CRWs
2. Consulted with Agriculture department to conduct farmers' refreshers training and support to the farmers for different crop demonstration project in kharif season.
3. Submitted Agriculture and land development data of the selected CRWs.
4. Conducted 72 village level awareness meeting scope of climate resilient works under MGNREGS.
5. Submitted 24 CRWs estimation to District Project Coordinator.
6. Female participant freely take place their voice on climate change issues in meeting.
7. Villagers are focusing to create durable assets on Land and water resources development.

Renovation of Tank at HADANBAHALI MUNDA

Kantesir village of Kesinga block of kalahandi district is a tribal area. In this year due to less rainfall, drought is seen. According to the report of government it involves under 70% drought. Then decide to do ICRG Project programme by focusing on its climate change. First a meeting is conducted in village then decides how to improve the condition of the all poor people, job card holder, farmers. After getting information we select Hadanbahali munda village, where 20 farmers protect from the drought of 25 acre land. Then job card holder also develops through this soil work. By the support of ICRG Project team Renovation of tank, switch gate, field channel, plantation for budget planning then a visit was done through the BDO, AE, JE from the block. The awareness programme had conducted by the block community facility worker and here inform to all the line department to do their duty sincerely. The main aim of this project is store rain water and utilize in agricultural work. Then create work day in MGNREGA to build the livelihood of the people strongly. We said the villagers through FGD Meeting to increase the water level of the earth crust for controlling of climate changes. With the help of this project a behavioral committee.

- Citizen has option to submit their grievance/complaint at District level
- Login-id/password based access to officers at different levels.
- Comments of officer at each stage and the message is available to complainer
- Option to restrict/show any complaint/Grievance in public view
- Option of uploading of documents at the time of disposal.
- SMS based alerts to citizens at every stage of update of status of their petition.
- The option for re opening of case in case the complainer is not satisfied

K. Skill building program for rural youth:

A total of 105 dropout youth were equipped with vocational skill such as, Driving Training, Garment making, Food Processing Training and Electrical and House wiring training. Total 30 male and 75 female were imparted the training successfully in training in our operational area M. Rampur and Baliguda block. Out of them, 8 male and 7 female youth have got employed and 14 male and 25 female self employed in this period. In order to support the trainees we have chalked out follow-up plan towards placement, bank linkages for employment / self employment, marketing of products etc.

30 male and 75 female youth trainees were capacitated on Entrepreneurship Development program. This is the part of their training courses with an aim to enable and empower them so that they themselves can take up the responsibility of their business plan, fund rising, financial arrangement plan along with entrepreneur norms as well as strengthening their attitude, behaviours with the costumers and also capacitated on different themes such as gender sensitization, HIV/AIDS awareness etc.



They are also improved their knowledge on Identification of key areas for well functions of entrepreneur and to identify opportunity available towards good functions which will ultimately support much on function. More over it has been discussed to keep up regular lessoning with promotional agencies which is also supportive in entrepreneurship development. Every participant could understand all norms of well function of Entrepreneurship.



SCOPE Model

Skilling Community Owned Promotion and Enhancement (SCOPE), is an innovative model of youth empowerment program that facilitates improved scope for sustainable livelihood to the youth. With informal sector and rural areas as its key domain, this model seeks to stimulate community ownership and participation in skills promotion so that rural youth are gainfully employed in the primary sector and contribute to regenerative rural economy.

During this programme PRA exercises are organized ten no of the selected villages from M.Rampur block Kalahandi district in Odisha to invite the community participation and ownership, and also to know the socio-economic, cultural and political situations, understanding of available resources, role of institutions, various stakeholders and their role in the decision making etc. in the process of implementation of SCOPE model.

The life of Dhanujya has Changed

Mr.Dhanujya Patra (34) belongs from a ST family. His father is very poor. He was study only 9th class. Due to some barrier i.e, financial & non facility of higher study, He has two children wife also father and mother; His family was staying in Manikera village of Manikera GP at M.Rampur Block in Kalahandi district. His family depended upon the Agriculture/daily wage labour work for their livelihood. It was not sufficient for daily family maintains. So he had wanted to migrating work in out of state like Gujarat, Chennai ,Bangalore .He always wanted how to maintain his family properly.

In last March 2016, SEBA JAGAT, started training Programme on Vocational Training to rural youth by the support of FVTRS, Bangalore. At the same time Mr Dhaurya came to know about this Programme. He applied & was selected to undergo in driving training Programme. He completed in this during this one month training course.

His sincerely effort he got a job in privately driver in a local far from his village. He earned 7000/- per month from this job. He is very happy with this job. Now he is confidence enough to earn.

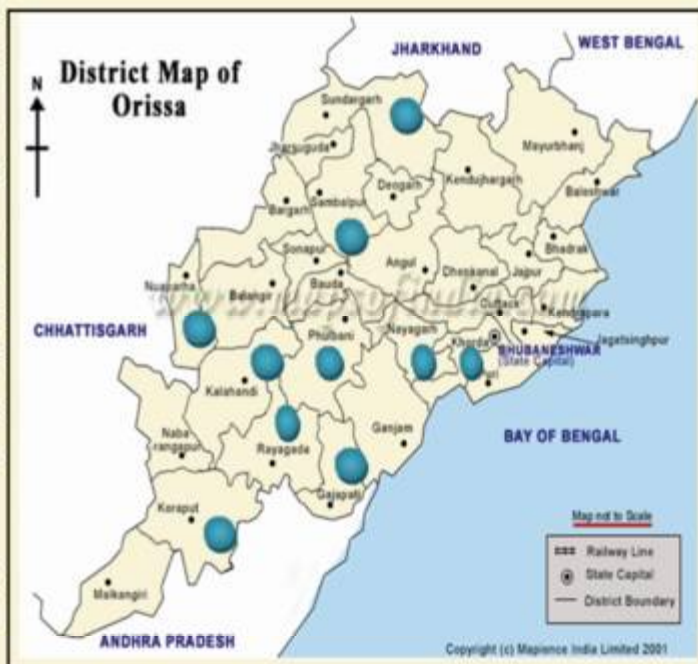
OPERATIONAL AREA AND COVERAGE

The operational area of Seba Jagat is located at the southern western, the most backward region, of Odisha. It covers three districts, Viz, Kalahandi, Nuapada and Kandhamal. At present, Seba Jagat is directly working in 9 Blocks i.e. Bhawanipatna, Kesinga, Karlamunda, M.Rampur, Lanjigarh, Narla and Golamunda of Kalahandi Districts, Boden block of Nuapada District and Baliguda Block of Kandhamal District of Orissa State and Indirect intervention in 9 Districts in Odisha with the Forum of Green Governance of odisha.

The Head Office of Seba Jagat M. Rampur is 378 kms distance from state capital Bhubaneswar and 55 kms from the district headquarter Bhawanipatna.

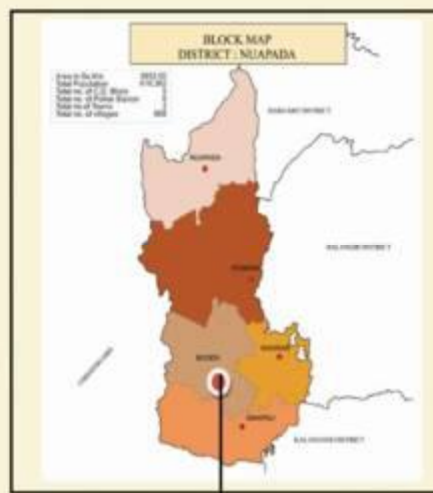

Operational Block Map of Seba Jagat in Kalahandi Dist



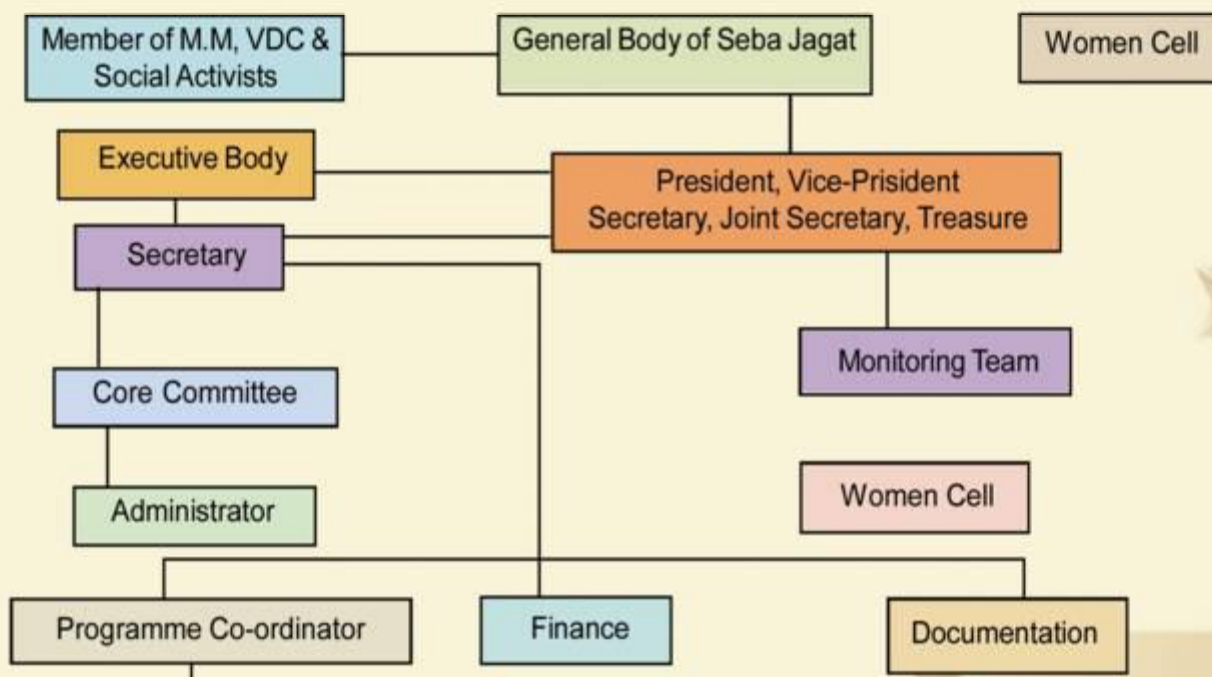
Operational Block Map of Seba Jagat in Nuapada Dist
